- Three-year program which starts August 1, 2011
- New and expanded areas of emphasis designed to align with new National Quality Strategy
- Organized into four “Aims” and three “Drivers”

 - Case Review
2. Improving Individual Patient care
 - Reduction of Health Care Acquired Conditions
 - Quality Reporting and Improvement



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10SOW AIMS (cont.)

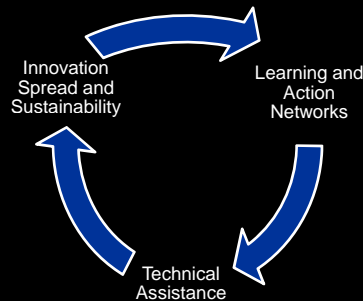
3. Integrating Care for Populations and Communities

4. Improving Health for Populations and Communities
 - Promotion of Immunizations and Screenings
 - Cardiovascular Health Campaign



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10SOW Drivers (3)

1. Supporting and Convening Learning and Action Networks
2. Providing Technical Assistance
3. Care Reinvention through Innovation Spread



What is new and different.....

- More emphasis on patient and family engagement
- New role in monitoring Medicare beneficiaries' experience with ACOs and value-based purchasing programs
- Expanded focus on community coalition formation and community engagement, and the use of Learning and Action Networks
- Focus on innovation spread, use of stories, leadership, sustainability
