## **Food Assistance Resources**

Minnesota offers the following resources to assist individuals and families.

  - Save on groceries by getting pre-packed fruits, vegetables, and meat. Over 30 locations in Twin Cities and St. Cloud metro areas are open once a month to everyone. There's no need to register in advance.
